5. be given a free copy of CLAVES - the seminary official newsletter, and the FSPA annual financial report.





Rationale of the Association

Since July 6, 1981, when St. Peter's College Seminary was founded, the vocation to the priesthood in the Diocese of San Pablo has increased. Ten years after, the Chair of St. Peter Foundation, Incorporated was created in order to offer financial assistance by way of scholarship grants to as many deserving seminarians. Indeed, it has been a great help to the seminary.

However, there are other basic needs that have not been fully considered, like the upgrading of the library, the just remuneration of its workers, the funding of some academic programs, the improvement of its facilities, and some financial help to the most in need seminarians.

On this regard, the seminary formators have organized this association of friends that can attend to the basic needs of the seminary.

What is the Friends of St. Peter Association?


The Friends of St. Peter Association is a non-profit, non-stock organization that acts as a supporting pillar of the seminary in improving its facilities for a better quality of formation and a noble sustenance of its workers. It is a charitable association nurtured with Christian values and inspired by an apostolic zeal to pray and help financially the seminary.

What are the objectives of the FSPA?

The Friends of St. Peter Association is committed to attain the following goals:

1. to provide scholarship grants to some poor and most deserving seminarians;

- (2) to assist in the subscription of books and journals, and the updating of the seminary library, laboratory, and computer workshop;
- (3) to promote a noble and just way of living in the seminary; and
- (4) to support the academic programs that could enhance a better quality of education.

How to become a member of FSPA?

In order to become a member of FSPA, one has to have a deep concern for the good of the seminary and a generous heart to help by giving an annual pledge.

An application form has to be submitted to the coordinator of FSPA or to any priest of the seminary.

How to become a coordinator of FSPA? What are his/her obligations?

Through personal initiative, inspired by the spirit of apostolic zeal, anyone can become a coordinator by simply applying to any priest of the seminary. The main obligations of coordinator are to recruit members, to give the remittances of their members to the treasurer, and to disseminate information regarding the association and the seminary.

How are members of FSPA classified?

The members of FSPA are classified as *regular* or *temporary members*. *Regular members* are those who commit themselves to help the seminary as long as the Lord permits them to do so. It could mean a lifetime service to the Church. *Temporary members* are those who commit themselves to help *occasionally* according to their financial capacity.

Regular members are classified also according to the amount of their annual pledge to the seminary.

Star member	below P1,000.00/year
Three-star member	P1,200.00/year
Superstar member	P2,400.00/year
Megastar member	P3,600.00/year
Star of the year member	P6,000.00/year
Star of all stars member	above P6,000.00/year

Members from abroad can give their donations in US dollar currency. Pledges can be remitted also in a monthly, quarterly or semestral basis.


Renewal of Membership

Every member should renew his/her membership every year in January for continuance of his/her pledges and should indicate in the renewal had there been any change in his/her membership.

Cessation of Membership

Regular members cease their membership upon death or physical incapacity, or when, by any reason whatsoever, they failed to give their pledges for the period of two years.

Any *coordinator* who willfully neglects his/her responsibility for a long period of time and without communication to any member of the board of advisers shall be considered dormant member, though with the possibility of renewal and readmission upon his/her return.
